District Awards and Definitions
Nomination Deadline: Monday, February 6, 2012

1. **Friends of Scouting**: For the person, organization, or business not directly connected with Scouting but who has been most supportive of our District. List the person in the nominated group who would be contacted to receive the award.
2. **Cub Scout Adult Rookie of the Year**: For the new Leader or Assistant Leader who has done a super job in his/her first year. Tenure is one year.
3. **Boy Scout Adult Rookie of the Year**: For the new Leader or Assistant Leader who has done a super job in his/her first year. Tenure is one year.
4. **Old Timer's Stepping Stones Award**: To recognize an individual who has been in Scouting for at least 20 years, serving in Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Venturing, or District.
5. **Extra Miler Award**: For any registered Scouter who has put forth extra effort to promote the Scouting program. This could be a Leader, parent, teacher, friend, spouse of a Leader, etc. No tenure is required but the Leader must be registered.
6. **Whispering Oak Award**: For any person who has put forth extra effort to promote and assist the Scouting program. This could be a non-Leader, parent, teacher, friend, spouse of a Leader, etc. No tenure is required and registration is not required.
7. **Foundation Stone Award**: For the best support person in a Unit or District. This is a person who works with the Cubmaster, Den Leader, Scoutmaster, or other Leader, helping to keep the program going.
8. **Cubmaster/Scoutmaster/Venture Advisor of the Year**: For the outstanding Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, and Venture Advisor in the District. Tenure is two or more years. Awards may be presented in each category.

All the listed awards may or may not be awarded.
